

Pocahontas County West Virginia Birding Trails West Fork Rail Trail, Greenbrier River

Habitat and Site Description- Habitat is composed of pastureland and woodlands containing Ash, Maple, hemlock, cattails and wildflowers. The USFS purchased the CSX abandoned right-of-way and restored the trail for hiking, biking and cross-country skiing that connects Durbin and Glady, WV.

Point of Reference- Durbin, WV on US250. LO:79-49-51.666W/LA:38-33-2.972N.

Directions to the trailheads of West Fork Trail TR312

Southern Terminus- Park across from Highland Street in Durbin on US250. Cross US250 and proceed about half a block and turn left to TR 312.

Northern Terminus- Proceed up Highland Street in Durbin and turn left on FR44. Drive 22 plus miles to Glady, turning left on CO22 for a short distance to the trailhead of TR312.

Trail descriptions-

West Fork Rail Trail TR312 is an exceptional scenic 22.2-mile trail of moderate difficulty that parallels the West Fork of the Greenbrier and Glady Fork. The trail varies in elevation from 3150 to 3420 feet. This is a popular wild flower trail.
